

Why Groundwater is Important to the Future of Humanity – John Cherry is raising a paradox in the global water crisis. Climate, wars, pandemics, and recessions threaten our society's future, but the most immediate threat is **disappearing** fresh water.

Eight of the 17 UN Sustainability Goals are dependent on groundwater. With drought, groundwater is the only water for food production in many countries and many drinking-water wells go dry.
